Chances are, you read the manual when you first buy the product, so you can assemble and use them. After the initial assembly, the manual is likely to get thrown in the recycling or lost in the dark abyss of a junk drawer, never to be seen or heard from again. There are two manuals that should be saved from that fate to safely install and use your child's car seat, your car seat manual and your vehicle manual should both be at your fingertips. Car Seat Questions The Top Five Important questions that parents ask technicians include the following How do I install it. What are the limits of the seat. How do I wash the cover. When does it expire. Should I use LATCH or seat belt. These are great questions, and we love to help caregivers with them. But a CPST is not a replacement for the information in your manual. Technicians may remember the specifics of certain seats, however, our main goal is to educate and empower you to know how to find that information yourself. We want parents to feel confident in their ability to choose a seat that fits their child correctly, install that seat properly, and use it correctly every time. This is a very important topic, as I've not yet met a child who didn't make a mess at some point, but each seat may require different care. For some seats the cover is machine washable; other seats

require you to spot clean only. This will be outlined in your manual, often in the final pages. Question four is a common issue for families who have been using a seat for some time. Learning that your seat expires may be surprising, but every seat on the market expires and that information is critical. Expiration dates are vastly different for different seats currently seats expire between 5 and 10 years and some seats have different expiration dates on the harness and the booster portion. The date of manufacture will likely be found on your seat itself, but an explanation of how long the seat is good for will be within the pages of your manual. In other words, you're going to need that manual for a long time keep it in a safe place. Car seat manual has information on the lower anchor limits as well Look for warnings about lower anchors in the car seat manual When LATCH was introduced in the early 00's, it was supposed to make installing child restraints easier, however, that is not always the case. Lower anchors have weight limits, meaning for older children LATCH is not an option. These limits can be confusing and you can read more about those limits here but your manual will have the information for your specific seat. 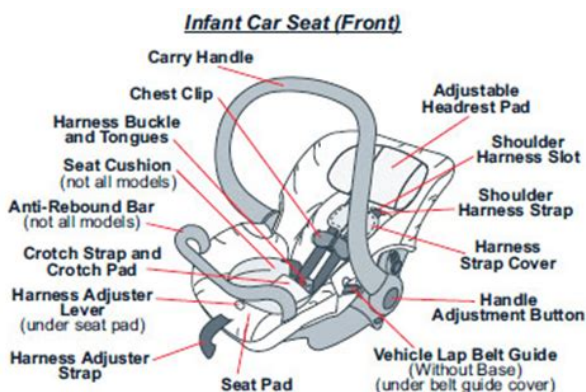

Pallas Series These are 2in1 car seats including impact shields which can be converted into highback booster seats when the child has grown big enough. When compared to seats with a backrest, booster seats pose a higher risk of injury. The main problem is the missing side protection. A booster seat with a backrest has side protectors that prevent the child from hitting the window in the case of a side impact collision. With a booster seat, however, the vulnerable parts of the child's body are not sufficiently protected. Additionally, the routing of the seat belt cannot be adjusted to the height of the child so that the belt is often too close to the neck. Due to the compact design of a car seat with a backrest, the child not only sits much firmer in the seat itself but is also much better protected due to the correct position of the seat belt.

For children that have reached a weight of 15 kilograms or a height of 100 cm approximately four years old, CYBEX has the Solution series of high back booster seats. These allow growing kids to sit comfortably in the car, while including safety features such as Linear Sideimpact Protection and a reclining headrest to help prevent your child's head from falling forwards and becoming vulnerable in the event of a crash. In order to assure the safety of your child, we highly recommend using our Solution series. However, none of our car seats can be used in a lieflat position inside the car. The baby's position in the infant car seat is designed in such a way that the forces arising in a collision can be absorbed by the seat, providing your baby with optimum levels of protection. These are specially designed to meet the anatomical requirements of newborn or very small babies. All CYBEX infant car seats include removable newborn inlays. Usually these can be removed when your child has reached a height of 61 cm, however always refer to the user guide provided with the product to ensure it is removed at the appropriate time. However, given the current state of child restraint technology we recommend placing a car seat in the rearfacing position until the child is four years old, or as long as this is possible. The reason for this is as follows. At the beginning of their lives children generally have relatively weak neck muscles and large heads in relation to the rest of their bodies. The older they get, the stronger their neck muscles get. Additionally, the difference in size between the head and the body evens out. However, in the event of a collision in the early years of development these two factors create a large amount of strain on their necks, making car crashes statistically more dangerous for this age group.

Therefore, physicians, accident researchers and consumer and health organizations recommend the transport of babies and toddlers in rearfacing child seats for as long as possible, but at least until they are 4 years old. If the child is travelling in a rearfacing position, the forces of an impact are distributed evenly over the large area of the car seat shell. The strain on the neck, head, and chest is significantly reduced, reducing the risk of injury when compared to a forwardfacing car seat. Therefore, physicians, accident researchers and consumer and health organizations recommend the transport of babies and toddlers in rearfacing child seats for as long as possible. For this reason, your child should wear thin, wellfitting clothing. Thick clothing such as winter jackets and clothing with hoods hoodies, teddy suits, etc. as well as hats should be avoided. Once your child has been positioned in the seat, he or she can be covered with a blanket for warmth. For other seating positions, whether or not the head and side airbags in your vehicle can remain activated depends entirely on the specifications provided by the manufacturer of the vehicle, and the recommendations in the user manuals of both the vehicle and the car seat. If your manufacturer states that this is

possible, then the head and side airbags can indeed remain activated without further concern. In this context, if your car seat has an extendable Linear Side Impact Protection System it is important that this is used in accordance with the descriptions in the seat manual even with activated side airbags. Prior to buying a car seat, we generally recommend testing it in your own car to see whether it can be installed easily and in compliance with the instructions. This also gives you the opportunity to have the installation process and other features demonstrated to you. Please always follow the recommendations of both the manufacturers of the car seat and the vehicle.

To ensure the future safety of your child it is essential that you no longer use a car seat and base after an accident. In a collision, huge forces act on both the car and the car seat. This can cause hairline cracks that are invisible to the naked eye. Through daily use, exposure to the sun and large fluctuations in temperature, an initially harmless hairline crack has the potential to trigger complete material failure in the event of a second collision. In this instance, your child would no longer be protected. Therefore, you should not under any circumstances use the car seat any longer, and should purchase a new seat. As soon as a car seat is installed in a vehicle, it may be exposed to high temperatures and high levels of light intensity. As a result, even high quality and extremely age resistant plastics such as those used by CYBEX can display certain age related alterations. To ensure the safety of your child, we strongly recommend that the seats are not used for longer than the prescribed usage periods. A car seat will be designed to keep your child safe for a specific period in their development, for example from birth to approximately four years old for a Sirona Series seat. Sometimes they can be used for longer, for example our products for babies and toddlers can also be used for a sibling. No two models are exactly alike. Most manufacturers are ok with spot cleaning with a mild soap, but sometimes there are other guidelines. It's important to understand that some materials, cleaning methods, and chemicals don't mix, and can actually cause damage to the seat. You should be able to find this information in the manual that came with the seat, or by finding the manual online directly on the manufacturer's website.

DO NOT use information on third party sites or youtube for how to clean information. Methods or advice from anywhere other than directly from the manufacturer are often full of errors that could result in accidental damage to your seat. If you do need to take your seat apart for cleaning per the manufacturer's instructions, one thing you can do is take pictures or videos of the seat before you take it apart. This is especially important at any area where the straps pass through and the upholstery is secured to the seat. Take shots of the whole seat as well from above, below, and the front and back. Each year, thousands of young children are killed or injured in car crashes. Proper use of car safety seats helps keep children safe. But, because so many different seats are on the market, many parents find this overwhelming.

If you are expectant parents, give yourselves enough time to learn how to properly install the car safety seat in your car, before your baby is born, to ensure a safe ride home from the hospital. The type of seat your child needs depends on several things, including your child's age, size, and developmental needs. Read on for more information from the American Academy of Pediatrics AAP about choosing the most appropriate car safety seat for your child. Most convertible seats have limits that will allow children to ride rear facing for 2 years or more. Many seats can accommodate children up to 65 pounds or more. Schoolaged children Booster All children whose weight or height exceeds the forwardfacing limit for their car safety seat should use a beltpositioning booster seat until the vehicle seat belt fits properly, typically when they have reached 4 feet 9 inches in height and are 8 to 12 years of age. All children younger than 13 years should ride in the back seat. All children younger than 13 years should ride in the back seat. LATCH is an attachment system for car safety seats. Lower anchors can be used instead of the seat belt to install the seat, and many parents find them easier to use in some cars. The top tether improves safety provided by the seat and is important to use for all forwardfacing seats, even those installed by using the vehicle seat belt. Although the seat belt and LATCH systems are equally safe, caregivers may prefer one system instead of the other. Keep in mind that only one system should be used unless the car safety seat and vehicle manufacturers say it is OK to use 2 systems at the same time. Vehicles with the LATCH system have lower anchors located in the back seat, where the seat cushions meet. Tether anchors are located behind the seat, either on the panel behind the seat in sedans or on the back of the seat, ceiling, or floor in most minivans, SUVs, hatchbacks,.

Nearly all passenger vehicles and all car safety seats made on or after September 1, 2002, are equipped to use LATCH. See vehicle owners manual for highest weight of child allowed to use top tether. All lower anchors are rated for a maximum weight of 65 pounds total weight includes car safety seat and child. Parents should check the car safety seat manufacturers recommendations for maximum weight a child can be to use lower anchors. New car safety seats have the maximum weight printed on their label. In most newer cars, you can lock the seat belt by pulling it all the way

out and then allowing it to retract to keep the seat belt tight around the car safety seat. In addition, many car safety seats have builtin lockoffs so you can lock the belt without having to lock the seat belt separately as well. Refer to the vehicle owners manual for details about how your seat belt locks. If possible, it may be best for the child to ride in the middle of the back seat. However, it is sometimes difficult to install a car safety seat tightly in the middle if the vehicle seat is narrow or uneven. Also, many vehicles do not have lower anchors for the middle seating position. It is safest to put the car safety seat in a position where you can install it tightly with either the lower anchor system or the seat belt; in some cases, this position may be on either side of the back seat rather than in the middle. A child passenger safety technician CPST or CPS technician can help you decide which place is best to install your child's car safety seat in your vehicle. All infants and toddlers should ride in a rearfacing seat until they reach the highest weight or height allowed by their car safety seat manufacturer. Most convertible seats have limits that will allow children to ride rear facing for 2 years or more. All parents can benefit from getting installation help from a CPST to ensure that their child's seat is properly installed.

**Types of RearFacing Seats** Three types of rearfacing seats are available. Are small and have carrying handles. Usually come with a base that can be left in the car. The seat clicks into and out of the base so you don't have to install the seat each time you use it. Parents can buy more than one base for additional vehicles. Should be used only for a child's travel not sleeping, feeding, or any other use outside the vehicle. Convertible seats used rear facing Can be used rear facing and, later, "converted" to forward facing for older children when they outgrow either the weight limit or the length limit for rear facing. This means the seat can be used longer by your child. Convertible seats are bulkier than infant seats, however, and they do not come with carrying handles or separate bases and are designed to stay in the car. Have a 5point harness that attaches at the shoulders, at the hips, and between the legs. Should be used only for a child's travel not sleeping, feeding, or any other use outside the vehicle. All-in-one seats used rear facing Can be used rear facing, forward facing, or as a belt positioning booster. This means the seat may be used longer by your child as your child grows. Are often bigger in size, so it is important to check that they fit in the vehicle while they are rear facing. **Installation Tips for RearFacing Seats** Always read the vehicle owners manual and the car safety seat manual before installing the seat. When using a rearfacing seat, keep the following tips in mind Place the harnesses in your rearfacing seat in slots that are at or below your child's shoulders. Ensure that the harness is snug you cannot pinch any slack between your fingers when testing the harness straps over the child's shoulders and that the retainer clip is placed at the center of the chest, even with your child's armpits. Make sure the car safety seat is installed tightly in the vehicle with either lower anchors or a locked seat belt.
